



## *Official university degree requirements*

Upon graduating from ESADE's **MSc Programmes in Management**, students are awarded an official university degree in line with the European Higher Education Area (EHEA - [www.ehea.info/members.aspx](http://www.ehea.info/members.aspx)). This degree acknowledges 60 ECTS credits.

### *Eligibility for the official Master in Business Administration qualification*

Before beginning the **MSc Programme in Management** course, students must have been awarded an undergraduate degree entitling them to undertake postgraduate studies in the degree-granting country.

For this purpose, the candidate must submit the following documents:

- Holders of a **Spanish university** degree must submit:
  - University degree **or**
  - European Diploma Supplement (DS) **or**
  - University receipt or certificate of the granting of the degree
- Holders of a foreign **undergraduate degree awarded by a country in the EHEA** ([www.ehea.info/members.aspx](http://www.ehea.info/members.aspx)) must submit:
  - University degree **or**
  - European Diploma Supplement (DS) **or**
  - University receipt or certificate of the granting of the degree
- Holders of a foreign **university qualification awarded by a country not in the EHEA** must submit:
  - University degree **or**
  - University receipt or certificate of the granting of the degree

Please note these documents must be originals or copies certified by one of the following:

- The issuing university **or**
- A public notary **or**
- The Spanish consulate **or**
- The consulate of the degree-granting country in Spain

**Legalization of documents:** if the documents submitted were issued in a country that does not belong to the EHEA or does not have a bilateral agreement with the EU ([www.ehea.info/members.aspx](http://www.ehea.info/members.aspx)), they must be duly legalised:

- Either by the process described in the Hague Convention Apostille (if the country is party to this convention - [http://www.hcch.net/index\\_en.php?act=text.display&tid=37](http://www.hcch.net/index_en.php?act=text.display&tid=37))
- Or by diplomatic legalisation (if the country is not party to the Hague Convention Apostille).

**Language of the documents:** if the documents submitted are in a language other than Catalan, Spanish or English, a sworn translation of the same must be provided.
