Language requirements	Depending on the language of instruction (English or German), bachelor exchange students must have a B2 level or above (according to the <u>Common European</u> <u>Framework of Reference for Languages</u> , CEFR) in English OR German. Bachelor students can only attend bachelor level courses, master students only master level courses. Course numbers at WU have a purely administrative function and change every semester.

German language courses

Before the semester	WU offers pre-semester German language courses with levels ranging from absolute beginners to highly advanced speakers. These two-week intensive language courses are principally free of charge. A fee for administration and teaching materials (\leq 40) will be charged. To participate, students need to apply by May 20 for the winter semester and by November 20 for the summer semester. Places are limited.	Orientatio Program Academic

Confirmation of Stay	Please note that a Confirmation of Stay will only be issued for the period of the student's actual studies at WU . Students can download their Confirmation of Stay. WU does not use a standardized percentage-based grading scale. The percentage scores needed to receive the grades given above differ from course to course. In most cases, the course-specific grading scales can be found in the course descriptions online.

Orientation services for exchange students

Orientation and Cultural WU offers a two-week program, which includes activities such as social events, a sightseeing program, out-of-town field trips, presentations on Austria, etc. and costs € 350. To participate, students need to apply by May 20 for the winter semester and by November 20 for the summer semester. Places are limited. For each WU partner university, a specific WU faculty Academic advisors member acts as an academic advisor. Academic advisors support students in selecting appropriate courses and give advice on relevant academic matters. The Austrian Students' Union (ÖH) at WU are available Buddy Network to help exchange students find a "buddy" – a WU student who acts as their personal mentor. General information	As an alternative to a full exchange semester, WU offers intensive three-week programs. These short academic programs take place at WU during the summer months (July and August). Students can attend two to three business courses on bachelor or master level. All courses are taught in English and cover several business-related topics.
	Bachelor and Master students can earn 8 ECTS credits.

The program includes networking opportunities and a cultural and social program with fellow students from all over the world. Course materials, lunch on lecture days, and the public transportation ticket for Vienna are included in the fees.

Registration WU partner universities can nominate their students to participate in this program as exchange students.

THEMIS curriculum components: one-year-format

Selection

Students will be selected by their home university and they will exchange on the fall term of the following academic year.

All students must demonstrate a superior level of academic performance, strong linguistic ability, as well as the desire and motivation for an international experience.

Study abroad term

It offers the opportunity to acquire core knowledge and skills in an international context. While on the exchange, students will have the chance to create their own study plan by choosing their courses out of those offered by the partner school and approved by the network.

• Joint Seminar

The THEMIS seminar provides students with a chance to delve deeper into an area of international law relevant to their academic career. The seminar will focus on different subject each year and will be conducted in English. The program will develop by professors from the partner schools, local experts, and international faculty members. It will also provide the students with the opportunity to meet and share information with fellow network participants.

• International Internship

The internship is considered to be an integral part of the THEMIS educational experience. The internship gives the student a chance to put their academic knowledge into practice and be- gin developing their professional career. The THEMIS partners strongly recommend international internship or internships conducted abroad in an international environment (law studios, European organizations, multinationals...) and for 6 weeks. Students develop their ability to work in an international setting through their professional internships, creating a profile well-appreciated by international organizations.
