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Milanovic's main area of work is income inequality, in individual countries and globally, as well as historically among pre-industrial societies (Roman Empire, Byzantium, and France before the Revolution). He has published a number of articles on the methodology and empirics of global income distribution and the effects of globalization (*Economic Journal*, *Review of Economics and Statistics*, *Journal of Economic Literature*, *Journal of Political Philosophy*, among others). His book, *The Haves and the Have-nots: A Brief and Idiosyncratic History of Global Inequality* (2011) was translated into seven languages and selected by *The Globalist* as the 2011 Book of the Year. His new book, *Global Inequality: A New Approach for the Age of Globalization* (2016), addresses economic and political effects of globalization, including the redefinition of the "Kuznets waves." It has received the Bruno Kreisky Prize for the best book of 2016 and is being translated into eleven languages.
