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**Course Goals** Students will develop several skills: Knowledge acquisition, comprehension and structuring, learning how to learn & Intellectual curiosity

**Prerequisites** No previous knowledge about Spanish Art or Culture is necessary.

### Description

**Course contribution to program** This course will provide students with a well rounded education in Art, Culture, Social Sciences and Humanities, beyond their Business Courses. Besides acquiring skills to appreciate and understand Spanish Art and Culture, they will leave the course better equipped to interact with Spanish professionals in the future, since they will share with their Spanish counterparts common artistic and cultural references.

**Short description** This course will provide students with a deeper understanding of Arts and Culture in recent Spanish history through some of the best Spanish and Catalan art produced in the 19th, 20th and 21st Century. Other Cultural manifestations such as Football, Spanish Pop Music, or Bullfighting will also be analysed for the same purpose.

25 hour long course (10 sessions, 2,5 hours each), taught in English, to discuss main Spanish artists and Cultural traditions, which illustrate Political and Social changes in Spain through the XIXth, XXth and XXIst centuries.

## Activities

### In-class discussions and debates

Impromptu debates and conversations about Spanish Food, Morals and Art, Meaning of Art or Bullfighting will be encouraged in class.

### Analytical exercises

Students will have to contribute analysis and opinions to several forums of opinion, which will be posted on the moodle page, for every student to read.

### Written and/or oral exams

Students will take two 15 minute-long mini-tests (mid-term and final), multiple choice style, consisting of 50 questions (a,b,c format, only one possible right answer). No point will be deducted for wrong answers

### Readings

About 50 % of the class will consist of lectures carried by the professor

### Presentations

Students will deliver one oral presentation, either individually or as a group, about a museum, restaurant, performance, or any other cultural activity in Barcelona, Catalunya or Spain.

### Essays

Each student will write a final paper in word and pdf format, to be uploaded onto the moodle page. Minimum length, 4 pages, double spaced. Par a) main take-aways from the course, part b) favourite cultural activities done while in Spain
