Course Goals

General learning objectives of the course:

Consolidate and extend knowledge to finalize grammar and lexic at B1 level:

Comprehension:

1. Quickly find relevant details in texts.
2. Deduce unfamiliar vocabulary through context.
3. Understand news programs and reports when they are articulated with relative clarity.

Expression:

1. Write clear texts on the topics covered in class.
2. Be able to summarize written and oral texts.
3. Be able to make a presentation on a class topic.

Prior knowledge

Knowledge of language acquisition techniques and skills.
Knowledge of English facilitates the learning of German.

Prerequisites

You have successfully completed the Deutsch 3 course or have demonstrated the corresponding knowledge in the level test (valid for 12 months).

Teaching methodology

Participative sessions:

- Face-to-face classes in small groups and based on the active participation of the participant.
- Comprehension practice of texts, both written and audio or audio-visual.
- Exercises to develop specific skills or assimilate structures and vocabulary (oral and written).

- Simulation of communicative situations to be solved, exchange of information with others, solving written tasks individually or in groups.
- Cooperative learning: exchange information with others in order to resolve real-life tasks.
- Acquisition of linguistic structures through discovery-based learning.

Independent work: The development of the course requires regular asynchronous work which encourages the assimilation of the subject matter.

Description

Course contribution to program

In a globalized world, business is no longer done only on a regional level, but on a much wider scale. This requires versatile and multilingual communication skills as well as cultural preparation. On the other hand, globalization also affects the job market in such a way that ESADE graduates not only compete with other graduates from Spain, but also from all over the world, young people who are often multilingual and culturally aware after several stays abroad. At ESADE, students have the opportunity to reach a level in a third language that will allow them to complete part of their university education abroad (in a country where that language is spoken) or to take advantage of job opportunities abroad. Deutsch 4 is the fourth of a program of six German courses that prepare for these purposes.

Short description

This course is designed for students who have basic knowledge equivalent to level B1.1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

On completion of level 4, you will have acquired the basic concepts of German grammar and basic vocabulary.

You will be able to:

- speak in simple terms, yet coherently, about your experiences
- describe events
- give opinions and develop a topic of discussion, establishing points of view in a clear and structured manner
- talk about your plans and projects
- hold a conversation about topics that are familiar to you
- write simple yet coherent texts on familiar topics

The target level corresponds to level B1.2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.
