Course Goals

By the end of this course, students should:

- Be able to apply ethical thinking to challenges related to the implementation of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs), as they relate to selected aspects of human rights;
- Acquire tools, knowledge, and skills that allow them to establish a thought-leadership position on the challenges discussed, and to communicate that position effectively to different stakeholders;
- Develop an understanding of what it means to be a responsible citizen and business leader in light of the SDGs.
